The salary scale is according to TV-L (or TVÜ-L) Entgeltgruppe 13. This is a position with 75% of the working hours compared to a full-time employee. The possibility to obtain further scientific qualification (e.g. a PhD) is given and supported.

Requirements:

You have obtained (or will obtain in the near future) a scientific university degree in mathematics, statistics, econometrics, economics, physics, business engineering or related studies with a mathematical focus and excellent grades. You are interested in the development of statistical and econometric methods, preferably in the research areas of the group and/or in innovative applications of these methods. You are committed to innovative teaching both with respect to content and teaching methods and have sound knowledge of relevant software packages (e.g. Matlab or R). You have strong interest in scientific work, are motivated to get acquainted with new topics and are a team player with good social skills and a high level of commitment to cooperation. English skills are highly desirable.

Tasks:

The tasks of successful candidates comprise research with the possibility of scientific qualification (i.e. obtaining a PhD), adequate involvement in teaching (3 hours per week) and support in the administrative tasks of the research group.

TU Dortmund has been pursuing the strategic goal of increasing the percentage of women in science and therefore encourages women to apply. Disabled candidates with essentially equal qualifications will be given preference. TU Dortmund supports the compatibility of family and work and promotes gender equality in science.
